



City of Crandall Stage 3 Water Conservation and Drought Plan Effective June 1st, 2013

North Texas Municipal Water District's two primary reservoirs (Lakes Lavon and Chapman) are approximately 8 feet below normal conservation level. We still cannot use water from Lake Texoma due to the presence of invasive zebra mussels. Customers are urged to check for and repair any leaks inside and outside the home and businesses.

The following restrictions are aimed at reducing water usage by 10 percent:

- Residential and business customers of landscaped areas with automatic sprinklers and irrigation systems shall be limited to water as follows:
 - If your address ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9) your day to water is Wednesday between 8:00 PM and Midnight.
 - If your address ends in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8) your day to water is Thursday between Midnight and 10 AM.
- Use of water to fill, refill or add to swimming pools or Jacuzzi-type pools is prohibited.
- Operation of ornamental fountains for aesthetic purposes is prohibited except where it is equipped with a re-circulation system.
- Use of fire hydrants shall be limited to fire fighting or permitted construction purposes.
- Irrigation for golf course shall be limited to the water sources from reclaimed water and sources other than the public water supply.
- The following uses of water are defined as non-essential and prohibited:
 - Washing down of side walks, driveways, parking lots, building or structures other than fire protection, or dust control.
- The only exceptions include foundations, new landscaping, new plantings (first year) of shrubs and trees may be watered for up to 2 hours, on any day, using a handheld hose, soaker hose, or using a drip irrigation system. Public athletic fields used for competition may be watered twice per week; and locations using other sources of water supply (not NTMWD) for irrigation may irrigate without restrictions.

REMINDER: Please only water when needed. If it rains, there is no need to water. Lawns need only 1 inch of water per week.
